

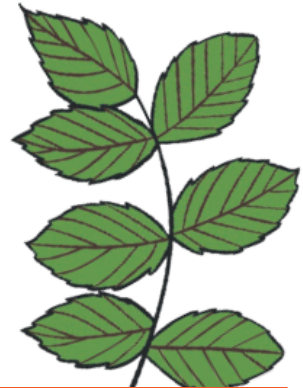
# Orangutans

Orangutans are red-haired apes. The word orangutan actually means 'person of the forest' and they are one of humankind's closest relatives.

## Where Do They Live?

Orangutans live in the tropical rainforests of Sumatra and on the island of Borneo in Southeast Asia.

Unlike other apes, orangutans do not like to live in groups. They spend almost their entire lives high in the trees. They travel by swinging from branch to branch using their long, strong arms and hook-shaped hands. They even sleep in leafy nests high off the ground. This protects them from their enemies: leopards and other big cats.

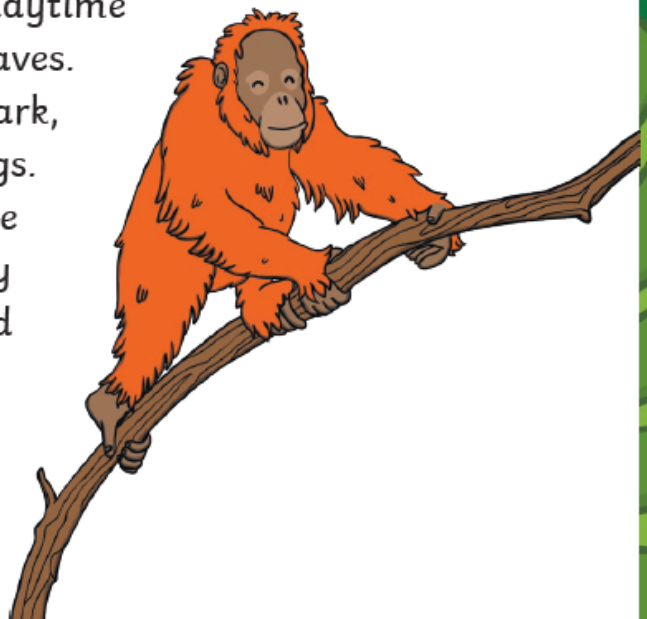


## Did You Know...?

Orangutans are actually an endangered species due to their habitats being destroyed and people hunting them.

## What Do They Eat?

Orangutans eat during the daytime and mainly enjoy fruit and leaves. Sometimes they also eat bark, honey, bugs and even birds' eggs. Their favourite fruit is from the durian tree. It smells stinky and tastes like garlic-flavoured cheese. Orangutans love it so much they have been known to sneak into gardens to pick it!



They can live to between 30 and 40 years in the wild.

Male orangutans can grow to be huge, weighing up to 100kg with an armspan of up to two metres.

Female orangutans give birth about every eight years and carry their young until they are about five years old. Infants also stay with their mother until they are at least ten years old.
