

<u>Emerald Tree Boa</u> <u>Introduction</u> A non-venomous snake. Found in the Amazon rainforest. Fairly solitary animals. Descend to the ground to climb a different tree. Move swiftly from tree to tree. Mostly active at night (nocturnal)	<u>Questions</u> <u>Introduction</u> What type of animal are they? Which area of the world are they often found? When are they most active?	<u>Orangutan</u> A type of red-haired ape. Found in the wild - tropical rainforests of Sumatra and Borneo (islands in South East Asia) Mostly active in the daytime (diurnal).
<u>Appearance</u> Distinctively bright green scales. Grow up to 2 metres in length and over 1 kg in weight. One pair of long, sharp teeth, pointing backwards. Forked tongue.	<u>Appearance</u> What colour are they? What size can they grow to? What can they weigh? What are their distinctive features?	Distinctive fluffy orange hair. Long, flexible arms to help climb and swing in trees. Arm span can grow up to 2 metres in length. Adult male can weigh 100kg.
<u>Diet</u> Feed mostly on small mammals (rats, bats and possums). Can be hunted by birds of prey.	<u>Diet</u> What do they eat? Are they prey for any other animal?	Fruit and leaves. Sometimes bugs, honey and bark. Favourite is durian fruit – smells of garlic cheese! Their predators are tigers, leopards and wild dogs.
<u>Habitat</u> Spend most time inhabiting trees. Coil around branches during the day. Often near rivers.	<u>Habitat</u> Where in the rainforest can they be found? Where do they spend most of their time?	High in the trees. Sleep in nest built in the trees. Travel around by swinging from tree to tree.
<u>Interesting facts</u> Life expectancy of approximately 20 years.	<u>Interesting facts</u> What other interesting information have you found out?	Did you know? Carry their infants until 5 years old. Orangutans are endangered because their habitat is being destroyed.
