Can you practise counting aloud in 2s, 5s and 10s to your grown up? What number can you get to?

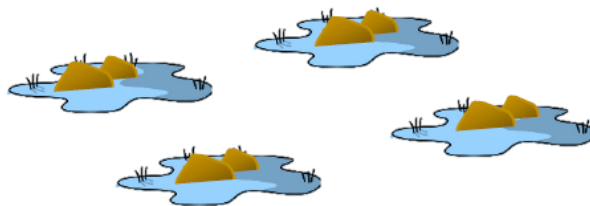
Can you count in 2s, 5s or 10s to add up how many in total:

$$2 + 2 + 2 + 2 = \square$$

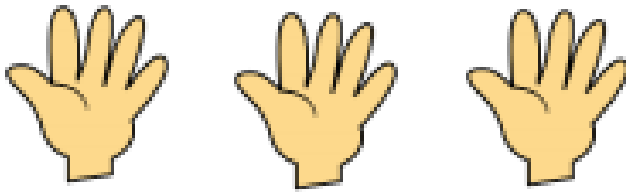
Damon has 2 pencils in each pot.

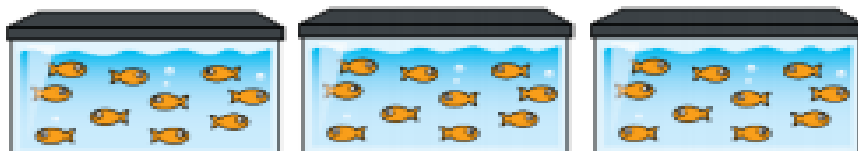
