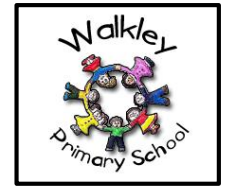


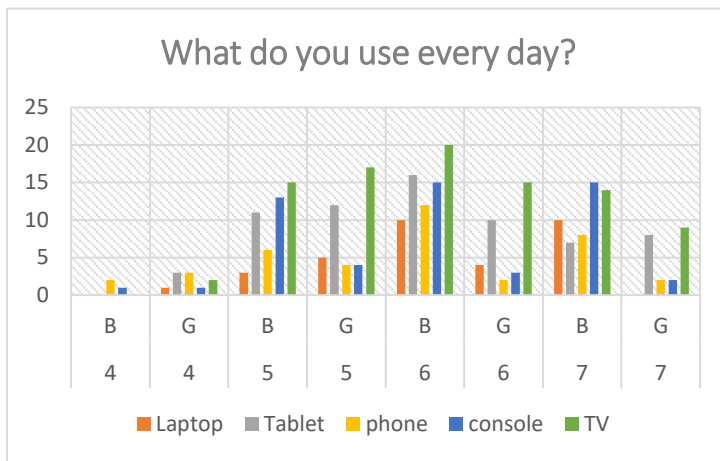
Pupil Questionnaire – Online Safety for pupils of Walkley Primary School

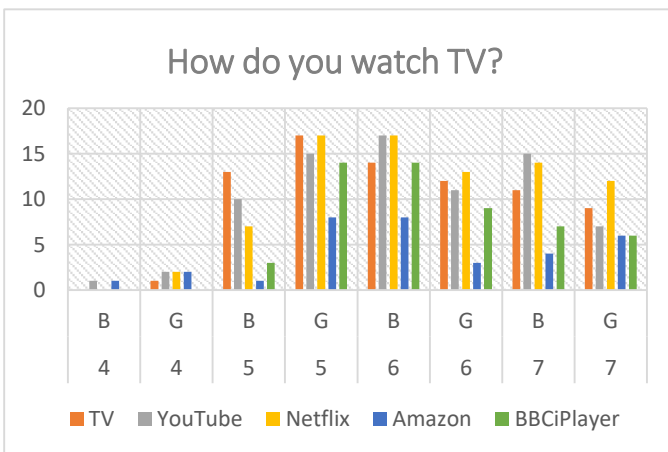
The following are the findings from the pupil questionnaire for **EYFS and KS1** pupils aged 4 to 7 years old

Question 1:



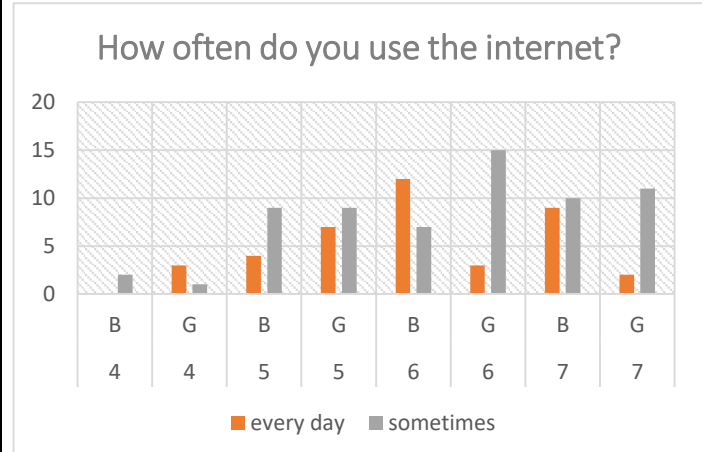
- Children aged 4 to 7 predominantly use the TV every day.
- Many of the boys use a console, however girls, on the whole, do not.
- Boys more regularly use a phone than girls.
- Boys and girls use a tablet more regularly than a laptop or desktop PC.

Question 2:



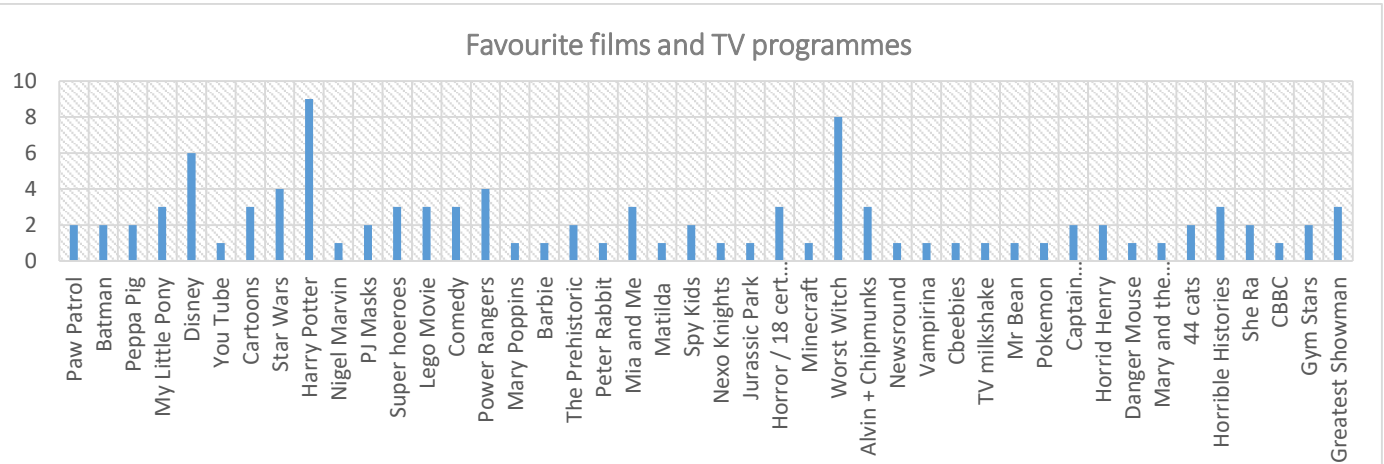
- Children are just as likely to watch YouTube or Netflix as they are TV.

Question 3:



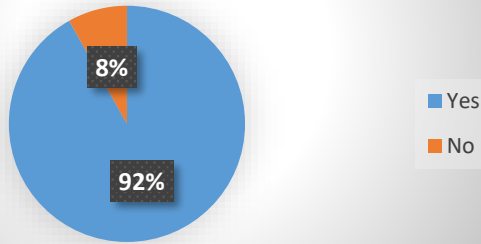
- Most 4-year-old girls and 6-year-old boys use the internet every day.

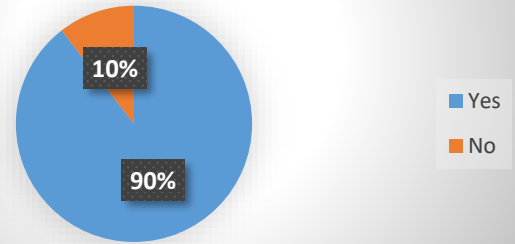

Do you feel safe online at school?

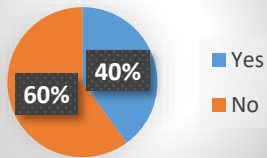


- 1 in 10 pupils feels unsafe at times when on the internet.

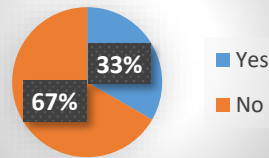

Have you seen something online that has upset you?

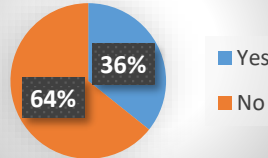
Age 4 boys and girls.



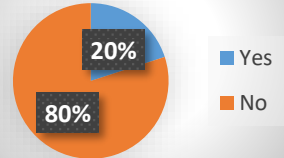
Age 5 boys and girls.



Age 6 boys and girls.

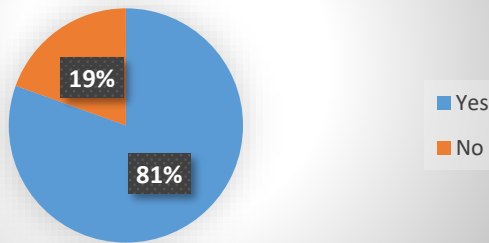


Age 7 boys and girls.



Question 8:

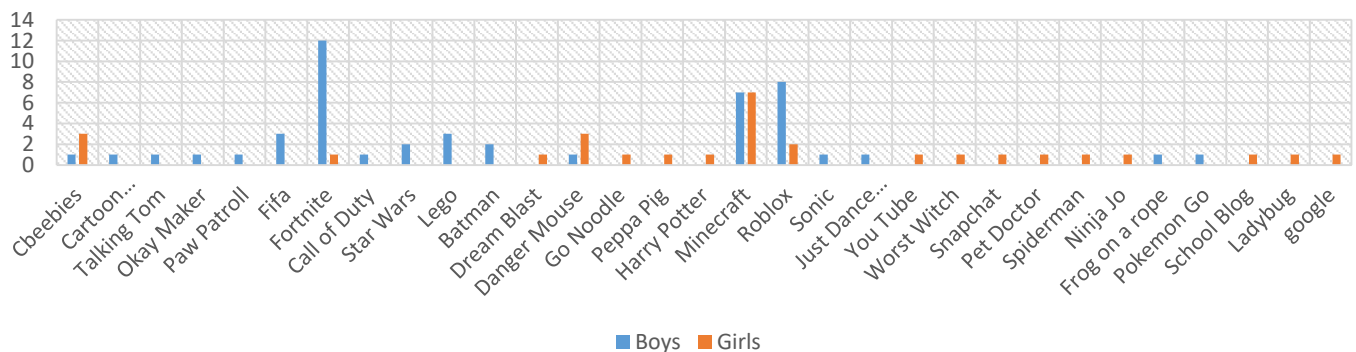
Do you know what to do if something upsets you online?



- 4 in 10 four and five-year olds are seeing things online that upset them.
- Children at age 7 report to be less likely to see things online that upset them than younger children.
- 8 out of 10 children between 4 and 7 years old know what to do if they see something that upsets them online.

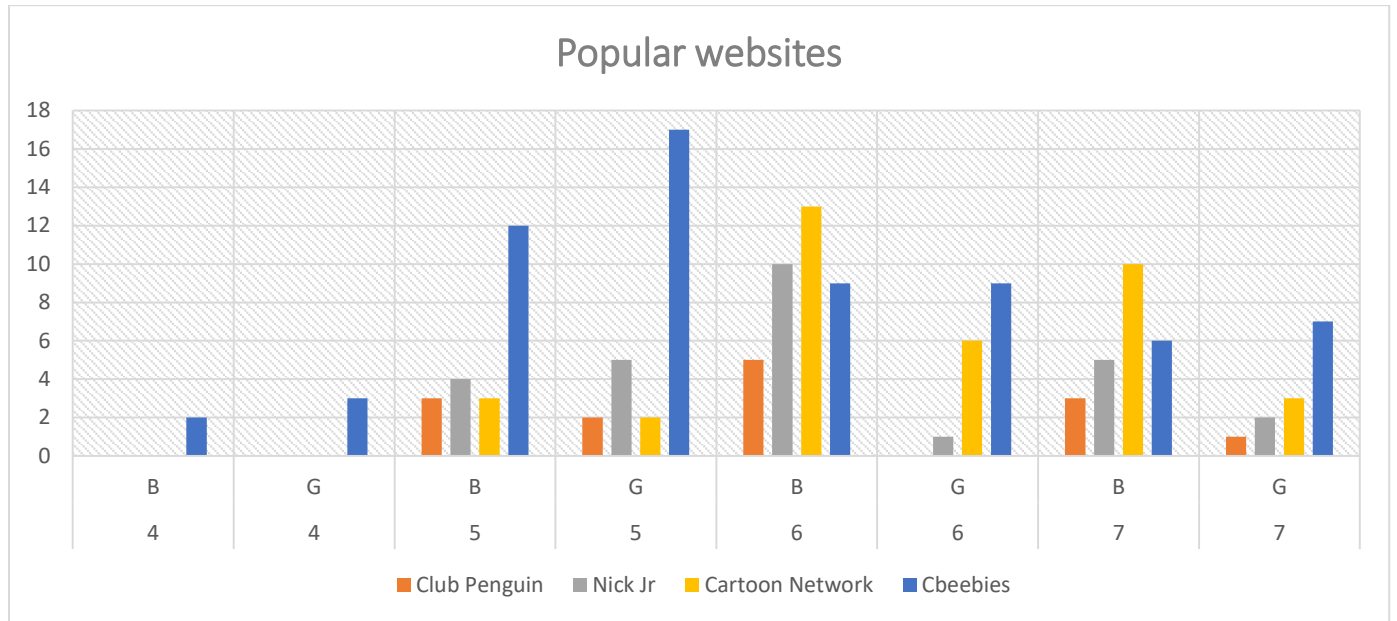
Question 9:

Favourite websites, Apps and games - boys and girls



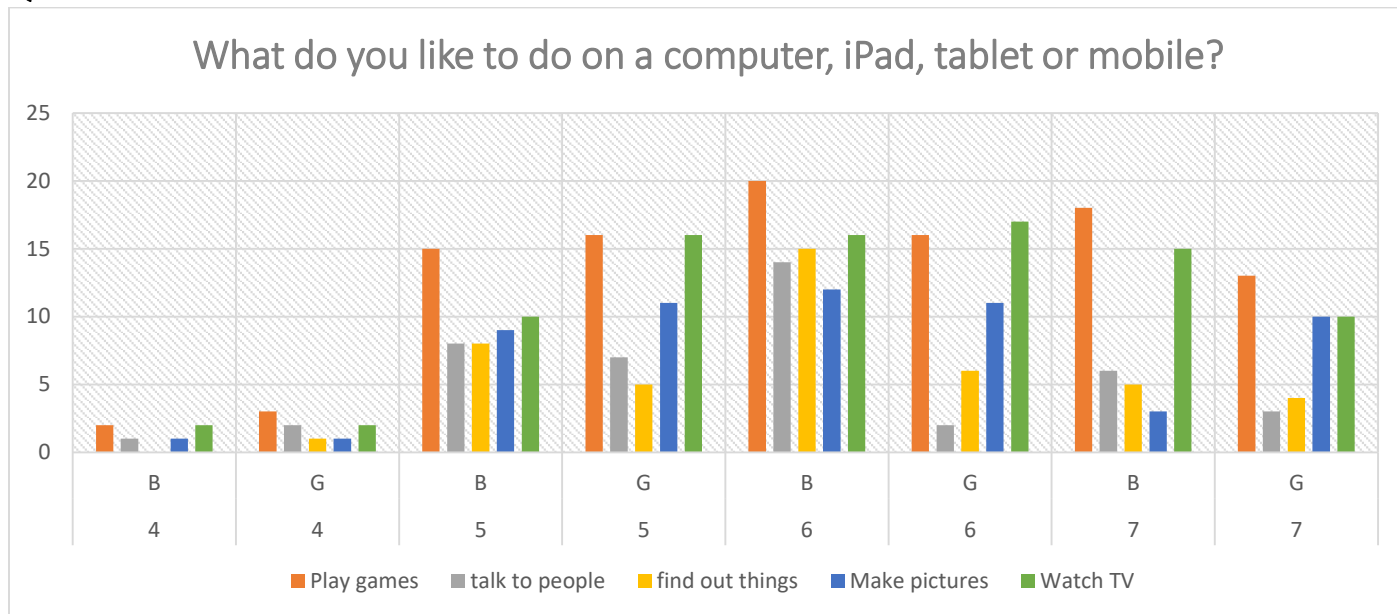
- More 4 to 7-year-old boys play games online than girls of the same age.
- Some children play games that are deemed unsuitable by age restriction guidance (PEGI rating).
- Minecraft is the most popular game for girls and boys to play.

Question 10:



- Up to the age of 5, Cbeebies is by far the most popular website.
- From age 6, children are more varied in their use of websites; Cartoon Network proving popular with boys aged 6 and 7 particularly.

Question 11:



- Boys and girls spend most of their time online playing games and watching TV.
- By age 7, girls are more likely to be making pictures and being creative online.
