The Big Picture

The Year 2s are setting sail around the world's 5 oceans. The children will look at a variety of world maps to identify different countries, the equator and the hemispheres. They will look in detail at different island countries and compare them with places in the UK.



End Point Knowledge

- to name the world's oceans and find them in an atlas/on a map or globe.
- To point out where the equator is.
- To discuss which places are hot and cold based on their position near the equator.
- Compare Cardiff (UK Capital city) and Port Moresby (Papua New Guinea capital)
- Identify some of the human and physical features of Cardiff (Capital City)
- Compare the UK to the Tobago (island location/non-European)
- Identify some of the human and physical features of Tobago (Non-European) including weather patterns and location to the equator
- To study the causes and impacts of plastic pollution
