to be:

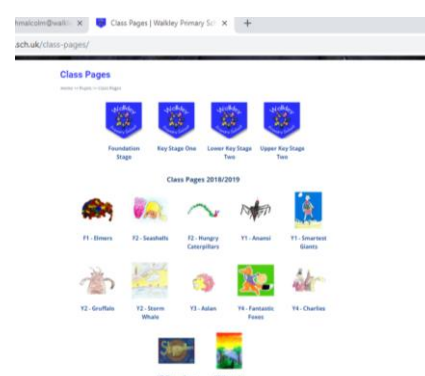
Use of everyday materials
