

TASK 1: MILD

Help Dr Frizzle by writing out each sentence again with the contracted word form.

Expanded form: In the morning, **they will** be going on holiday.

Contracted form: In the morning, **they'll** be going on holiday.

TASK 2: HOT

OH NO! Dr Frizzle has missed all the apostrophes off the 'What you will need' section. Add the apostrophe to each contracted word so that sentences make sense.

What youll need:

- An extra-large bunch of red or yellow roses (often sold at your local supermarket- these mustnt be green)
- 1 reinforced cage measuring approximately 8m x 8m – steel is an excellent material to use due to its strength (Paper isnt so good)
- Rubber gloves (check youve got the right size but if not, they can be purchased at your local garden centre)
- Lots of leaves, twigs and foliage (if you cant get your hands on any, if in winter, chopping up a large Christmas tree will suffice)
- Magic padlock or rope which hasnt been used before

TASK 3: SPICY

Can you help Dr Frizzle find some bossy verbs, time adverbials and some contractions?

What to do:

First, put the cage in the centre of your garden and cover it with the leaves, twigs and foliage. Completely covering the cage is vital, as an intelligent Grass Goblin will soon spot a trap- they're pretty clever!

Secondly, place several of the roses into the cage and make a trail with the rest leading all the way into the cage. You mustn't rush this part.
