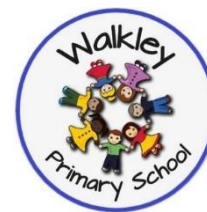

Books

Literacy-Read, Write, Inc



Children continue to learn set 1, set 2 and set 3 sounds in Read, Write, Inc groups according to their ability. They are then learning to blend and segment (read and spell) words using these sounds in order to read books and write sentences. They will bring home books which are linked to the books which they have read in school to practise at home. Their books will help them to practise the sounds which they are learning, the key green words containing these sounds and tricky red words. Please continue to read daily with your child to improve their confidence, fluency and comprehension skills. The current expected level for Y1 is yellow. In writing children are learning to use full stops, capital letters and finger spaces so that they can clearly read their writing. We are learning to form letters correctly starting at the top, ensuring they are the correct size and sat on the line.

Science

We will continue learning about plants in Science this term. The children will learn about the different parts of a plant. They will also learn what plants need to survive and will plant seeds of their own, observing their growth and conducting an experiment to test what plants need.

Maths

In maths we will be working on Multiplication and division for the first time in Y1. This will involve lots of counting in 2s, 5s and 10s, along with making and recognising equal groups. The children will come to understand multiplication as repeated addition; adding "groups of" the same amount and division as splitting up a whole amount by sharing or grouping.

Geography	<i>We will continue our work on villages, towns and cities, learning about the countries of the UK before understanding the difference between a village, town and city.</i>

<i>In computing we will continue learning about algorithms. The children will explore giving 'bee-bots' instructions. These are small robots in the shape of a bee.</i>	Computing

Religious Education	<i>We will be learning about Judaism this term, specifically the tradition of 'Shabbat'. The children will be considering the question, "Is Shabbat important to Jewish children?"</i>

Music	<i>Your Imagination – children will be learning how to use their imagination in music. They will also be working with various songs to find the pulse, rhythm and pitch. They will explore these using instruments.</i>

Home Learning
<i>The most important home learning you can do at home is listen to your child read and keep a record in their reading diary.</i>
<i>Maths homework should give you a taste of what we are learning this week in school.</i>
<i>Spellings are published on Google Classroom and you can play spellings games on EdShed.</i>
<i>Finally a creative orange book will have tasks to complete on a six weekly basis. These jobs can be done online or in the orange book.</i>
<i>Homework is not compulsory, but should meet the needs of your child to help support their learning.</i>

PE	<i>In PE we will be developing skills in net and wall. In this unit the children will explore and develop their skills in using a racket to send a ball. They will also learn how to keep score during a simple game.</i>
