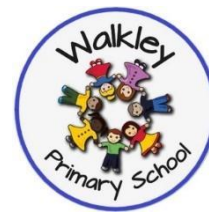

PE

In PE this term we will be practising hand-eye co-ordination skills through golf.

We will also be developing our athletic skills focussing on how to persevere to achieve our personal best.

Science

This half term in Science, we will be completing our topic on Evolution and Inheritance. We will then start our Electricity topic where we will be learning about and exploring using different components in circuits.

English

This half term in English, the children will be studying the poem 'The Highwayman' by Alfred Noyes. We will be researching highwayman in order to understand the context of the poem and then analyse the figurative language used. The children will also have an opportunity to develop our speaking and listening skills and perform the poem to others.

Following this, the children will write a biography of a notable and inspirational sports person. Within this non-fiction text, children will be required to manipulate more formal language forms such as passive voice, perfect progressive tense and the subjunctive mood.

Maths

In Maths this half term, we will be covering the topic of statistics.

Our focuses will be:

- *Reading and understanding different types of charts;*
- *Drawing charts from data;*
- *Finding the mean;*
- *Understanding probability.*

We will also be continuing our review and revision sessions to prepare pupils for their SATs in Week 5.

History	<i>We will be continuing to learn about the treatment of slaves, natives, minorities and immigrants through the Civil War and Reconstruction, up to the modern-day.</i>
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<i>In Citizenship this half-term, we continue looking at prejudice and discrimination. We will also be working on transition to Secondary School, including forming and maintaining friendships.</i>	Citizenship
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RE	<i>During Summer 1, our RE focus on the belief and meanings in the Islamic religion. We will look at the belief in Akrah (life after death) and explore how the concept of Jihad can be interpreted differently.</i>
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<i>Our music lessons this half term will be focusing on inspirational women in the music industry. We will also be learning songs for our production.</i>	Music
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Spanish	<i>In Spanish this half-term, we will be exploring the vocabulary surrounding music and expressing musical preferences.</i>
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Revision	<i>This term, we are continuing with the additional sessions to support pupils in preparation for the SATs in May. These will involve a mixture of revision of previous learning and test practice. This will be a supportive process for the pupils to ensure they are confident and fully prepared to take the tests in May.</i> <i>To ensure pupils received the full Y6 curriculum, some subjects will be taught as projects in the Summer term. If you have any questions regarding the SATs, please get in touch.</i>
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Home Learning	
<i>Home learning will be set on a Friday to be completed by the following Thursday.</i>	
<i>Children will be given a sequence of 6 activities to complete one each week to consolidate and extend the learning within the geography and history unit.</i>	
<i>Children will have weekly spellings set to learn on Spelling Shed which follow the spelling pattern that will have been taught in school. These will be tested in school on Friday.</i>	
<i>Children will also be set a google quiz as their maths homework – children can access this using their Google Classroom account.</i>
