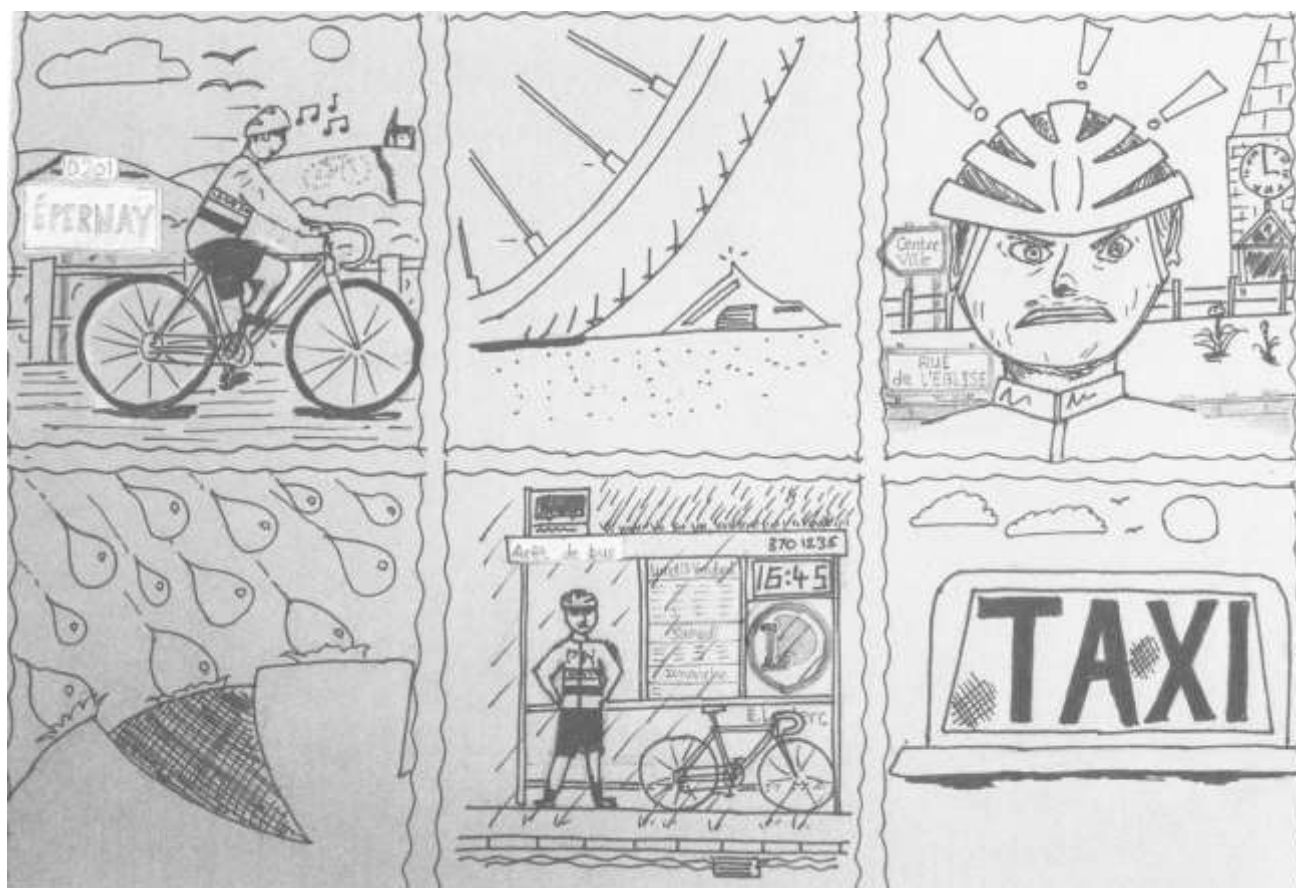




For your next writing task, we would like you to write us a short story. Continuing our theme of France, we'd like you to set your story in France (you might need to do a little research here – names of supermarkets, common shops or other buildings that you might find in a French town, words on road signs, that sort of thing).

Here is a storyboard of the story we would like you to write. This will help you to structure and plan your writing.



You will need to think about the character – who is this person? Are they French, or a visitor? What are they doing? Why? Where? When? What about the events in the story? Are there problems – how are they resolved? Does the character's mood change over time?

Before you begin, read the Remember Tos carefully and think about how you can include these in your writing.
