

Group 1:

Doubling consonants

When adding suffixes to one-syllable words, it's helpful to follow the CVC rule. CVC stands for “consonant, vowel, consonant.”

When the last three letters of a one-syllable word follow the CVC pattern, the last consonant should be doubled when adding the ending.

swim → swimming, swimmer
run → running, runner
hum → humming, hummed
begin → beginning, beginner
nap → napping, napped
jog → jogging, jogged
