Prefixes in- il- im- ir-

Please can you practise these spellings for next week?

These words contain a prefix that gives a clue to the meaning of the word. The prefixes change slightly however, with the spelling of the root word.

1. The prefix in- means 'not'.
2. Before a root word starting with l, in- becomes il.
3. Before a root word starting with m or p, in- becomes im-.
4. Before a root word starting with r, in- becomes ir-.
