



Whilst they look very beautiful, big cats are fierce predators. Many big cats live in **Africa** and **Asia**. The only one whose **habitat** is in the **Americas** is the **jaguar**.

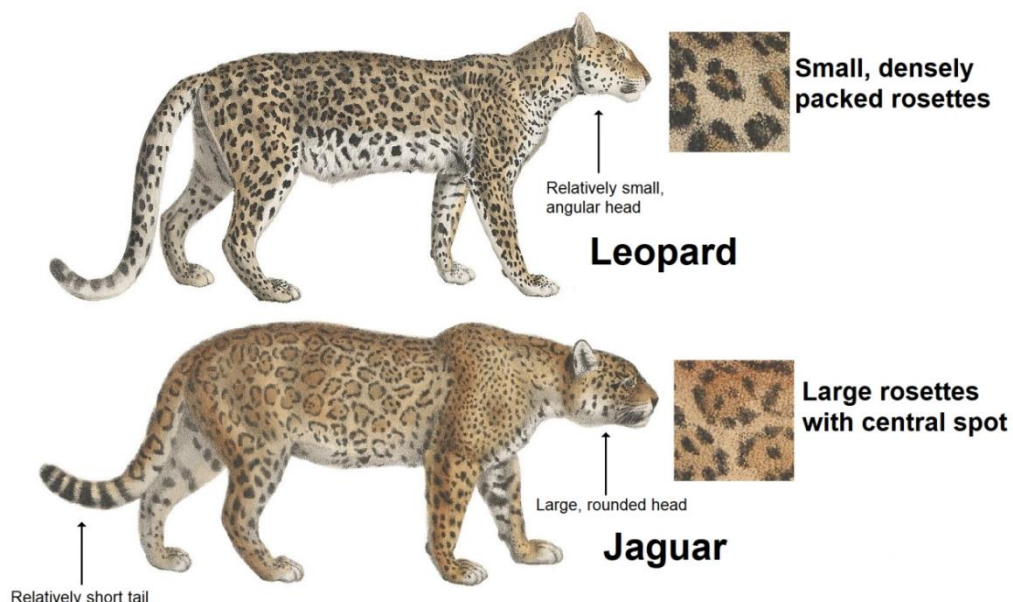
Jaguars are one of the largest of the big cats. In fact, only tigers and lions are bigger. Males weigh up to 250 pounds, while females are smaller.



The jaguar has a spotted fur coat. It is easy to confuse it with the **leopard**, but upon a closer look we would see that there are differences between the two.

For example, the leopard:

- has a lighter body;
- has longer legs;
- moves more smoothly;
- has smaller **rosettes**, which don't have tiny black spots in the middle.



Fact File

1. Jaguars are nocturnal. They lounge around during the day and hunt at night.
2. Some leopards and jaguars have black fur with black spots. They are called **panthers**.
3. Jaguars love to swim in lakes and rivers.
4. Jaguars wave their tails over water to attract fish.



Like all cats, jaguars are **carnivores**. They hunt their prey by **stalking** it through the grass and trees. Then they pounce for the kill. Jaguars eat wild pigs, turtles, cows and even caiman, which are like alligators.

Jaguars make fierce and protective mothers. Baby jaguars are called **cubs**. Jaguar cubs usually come in litters of 2 - 4. After six months, the cubs' mother will teach them how to hunt, and after their second birthday, the cub will leave their mother to live on their own.



Glossary

Caiman: a type of reptile similar to an alligator

Carnivore: an animal that eats meat, not plants

Habitat: the landscape that an animal prefers to live in

Rosette: a marking or group of markings that look like a rose

Stalking: sneaking up silently behind something
