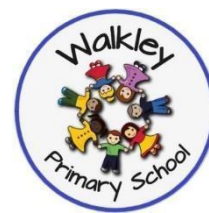

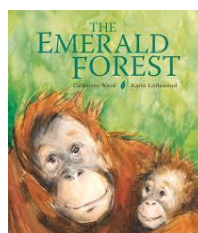
Please remember to wear your PE kit and suitable footwear to school on these days and remove any jewellery.

English

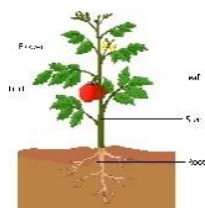
In English this half term, we will continue with our theme of the rainforest, focusing on the animals that live there. We will research one of the rainforest's cutest inhabitants, the sloth, in order to write our own fact files.

We will then be exploring the Greenpeace advert *'There's a Rangtan in my Bedroom'* and the ongoing debates surrounding deforestation. We will be learning how to write persuasively in order to save our precious rainforests.



Science

In Science this half term, we will be continuing learning all about plants! We will:



- identify and describe the functions of different parts of flowering plants: roots, stem/trunk, leaves and flowers
- explore the requirements of plants for life and growth (air, light, water, nutrients from soil, and room to grow) and how they vary from plant to plant
- investigate the way in which water is transported within plants
- explore the part that flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants, including pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal.

Maths

In Maths this half term we will continue learning about length and perimeter and will be practising:

- measuring, comparing, adding and subtracting lengths in m, cm and mm
- measuring the perimeter of simple 2-D shapes

We will also be starting our topic *'Fantastic Fractions'* where we will learn how to compare and order unit fractions, as well as developing our understanding of equivalent fractions.

Keep up that super times table practise at home!



Geography

In Geography, we will be continuing our adventure '*Exploring the Rainforest*'. We will be learning about the groups of people who live in the rainforest and the global issues around deforestation.

We will also be using our forest school sessions to practice our map skills.



Computing

In Computing this half term, we will explore different ways in which data can be presented and will learn about databases and how they are used. We will use this knowledge to create a class database about rainforest animals.

Citizenship

In Citizenship, we will be continuing to discuss how we can help the people around us. We will make links with our previous learning in Y2 Geography concerning plastic pollution.

Religious Education

In RE this half term, we will be exploring Christian beliefs about the kingdom of God. We will look at the story of Pentecost and develop our understanding of the Holy Spirit. We will think about how these beliefs impact how Christians live their lives.

Spanish

In Spanish this half term, we will be learning new vocabulary for colours and fruit and building these into our daily conversations.

Music

In music this half term, the Borrowers will be starting their violin lessons with Sheffield Music Hub.

The Aslans will be learning the song '*Let Your Spirit Fly*'. They will also be learning to accompany the song on the glockenspiel and will be composing our own musical accompaniment.

Home Learning

Home learning will be set on a Friday to be completed by the following Wednesday.

Children will be given a sequence of 6 activities to complete one each week to consolidate and extend the learning within the geography and history unit. Children will have weekly spellings set to learn on Spelling Shed which follow the spelling pattern that will have been taught in school. These will be tested in school on Friday.

Children will also be set as google quiz as their maths homework – children can access this using their Google Classroom account.

We also ask that children read regularly at home – please complete the home school reading record when your child reads at home.



PE

It's Y3's turn to *Dazzle Dance*! Our next dance will take inspiration from the vibrant Rio Carnival.

We will also be learning how to play tag rugby. We will be practising our passing, tackling and scoring skills, and developing our agility and our understanding of defending in order to play competitively.
