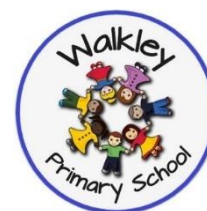

Forest School will take place, w/c 10th February.



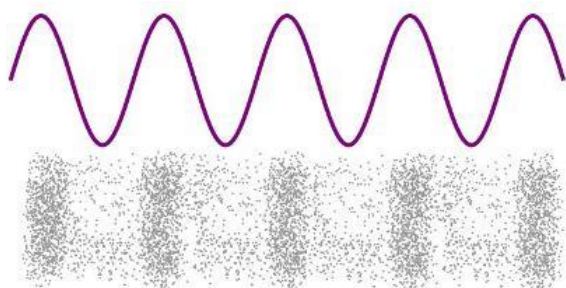
English

In English, we are studying the wonderful book, "The Girl Who Stole an Elephant" by Nizrana Farook. We have looked at the setting, which is in Sri Lanka, and the author. This term we will write a playscript inspired by one of the book's chapters and then writing a non-chronological report on elephants.



Science

In Science, we will be continuing to learn all about Sound. The children will learn that if an object vibrates the air particles called molecules close to it vibrate. We will be looking at how particles vibrate in an experiment on forming a sound wave.



Maths

In maths this term, we will be:

- Continuing to learn to multiply and divide
- Understanding Length and perimeter
- Using, converting and adding Fractions
- Working with decimals

Furthermore, we will be learning CLIC skills and facts such as smile multiplication, counting along scales, developing efficient methods of addition and multiplication.

Geography	In Geography, we will continue our Rivers topic. We will study the features of a river and learn how ox bow lakes are formed. We will look at the main causes of flooding, how it affects people and what can be done to prevent it. We will locate key rivers of the UK and the world, and then focus in on a river closer to home.
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In Computing, we will investigate how data is shared online. We will understand how computers are connected to the internet and look at how a website shares its data. Finally, we will collect data and share the information online.	Computing
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Religious Education	In RE this term, we will be continuing to study Christianity where we will be discussing and learning about the Trinity and why it is so important for Christians.
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We will be continuing to think about community and where we feel a sense of belonging. We will be learning about online safety and how to protect private information. We will also be educating ourselves about the risks of 'fake news' and echo chambers.	Citizenship
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Design Technology	In DT, we will be studying textiles, focusing on creating a 3D object from 2D pieces. We will explore the techniques used to create soft toys and fabric decorations, develop our sewing skills. We will then design, make and evaluate a 3D decoration.
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In Spanish this half term we will be learning to count to 200, asking for classroom stationary, learning the Spanish alphabet and going shopping.	Spanish
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Music	On Mondays, Chayas will continue their violin lessons with Sheffield Music Hub. The Charlies will develop their musical skills on glockenspiels.
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PE	In PE, both classes will be learning the rules, skills and tactics of rounders. The Charlies will be enjoying the last few weeks of swimming. The Chayas will be doing athletics, developing their sprinting, jumping and throwing technique.
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Home Learning	
<i>Home learning will be set on a Friday to be completed by the following Wednesday.</i> <i>Children will be given a sequence of 6 activities to complete one each week to consolidate and extend the learning within the geography and history unit.</i> <i>Children will have weekly spellings set to learn on Spelling Shed which follow the spelling pattern that will have been taught in school. These will be tested in school on Friday.</i> <i>Children will also be set a google quiz as their maths homework – children can access this using their Google Classroom account.</i> <i>We also ask that children read regularly at home – please complete the home school reading record when your child reads at home.</i>
