

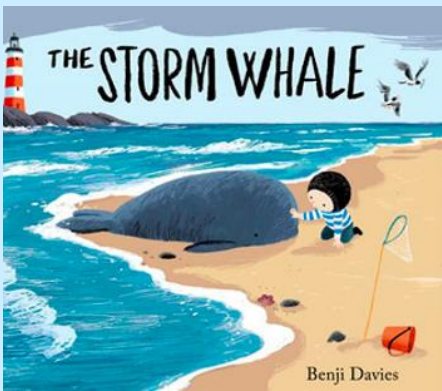


Welcome to the Storm whales!

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Topics for Year 2

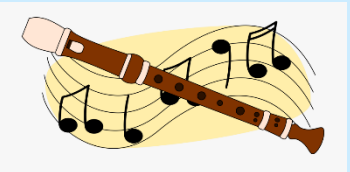

<i>In our first half term we will be challenged to plan, script, design and perform a Storm whale show to Key Stage 1! It could be a shadow puppet show in our forest or something else. We will decide and plan it together!</i>	<i>In this topic we imagine we are on a scientific research ship charting the world's 5 oceans. We will discover different sea creatures and island cultures. Finally, we will look at plastic pollution and how we can help our blue planet.</i>	<i>We will visit the incredible country of Japan. We will need to sharpen our historical research and artistic skills to meet the deadline at the New York headquarters!</i>

What is the same and what is different in Year 2?

There are lots of things that will stay the same for you in the Storm whales. Class wide rewards will remain and you will continue to be able to vote for your class wide reward parties. In year 2 we will have the opportunity to have recorder lessons for half of the academic year. Also we will get a Times Table Rock Stars account where you can learn and stretch your times tables skills at school and online at home. Ways to get ready for Year 2

- Try to read with someone every day over the summer holidays. It's great to get lost in a good story. There are some great online reads on the new Key Stage 1 Virtual Library that you can access through the school blog. Also if your adult visits the oxford owls website (<https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/>) they can set up a free account where you have access to lots of levelled Oxford Reading tree books like the Biff, Chip and Kipper series.
- Ask if you can look at your adult's coins and count different amounts. Remember you must ask first!
- Practise reading and telling the time with different clocks in your home
- Add in 2s and 5s to practise your times tables
- Spend lots of time outdoors - playing, exercising and exploring the wonderful green places we have in our city.
- Talk with an adult and complete the form attached for discussion on your return to school – we want to know about you and how we can help you.
